many great moments as a class.

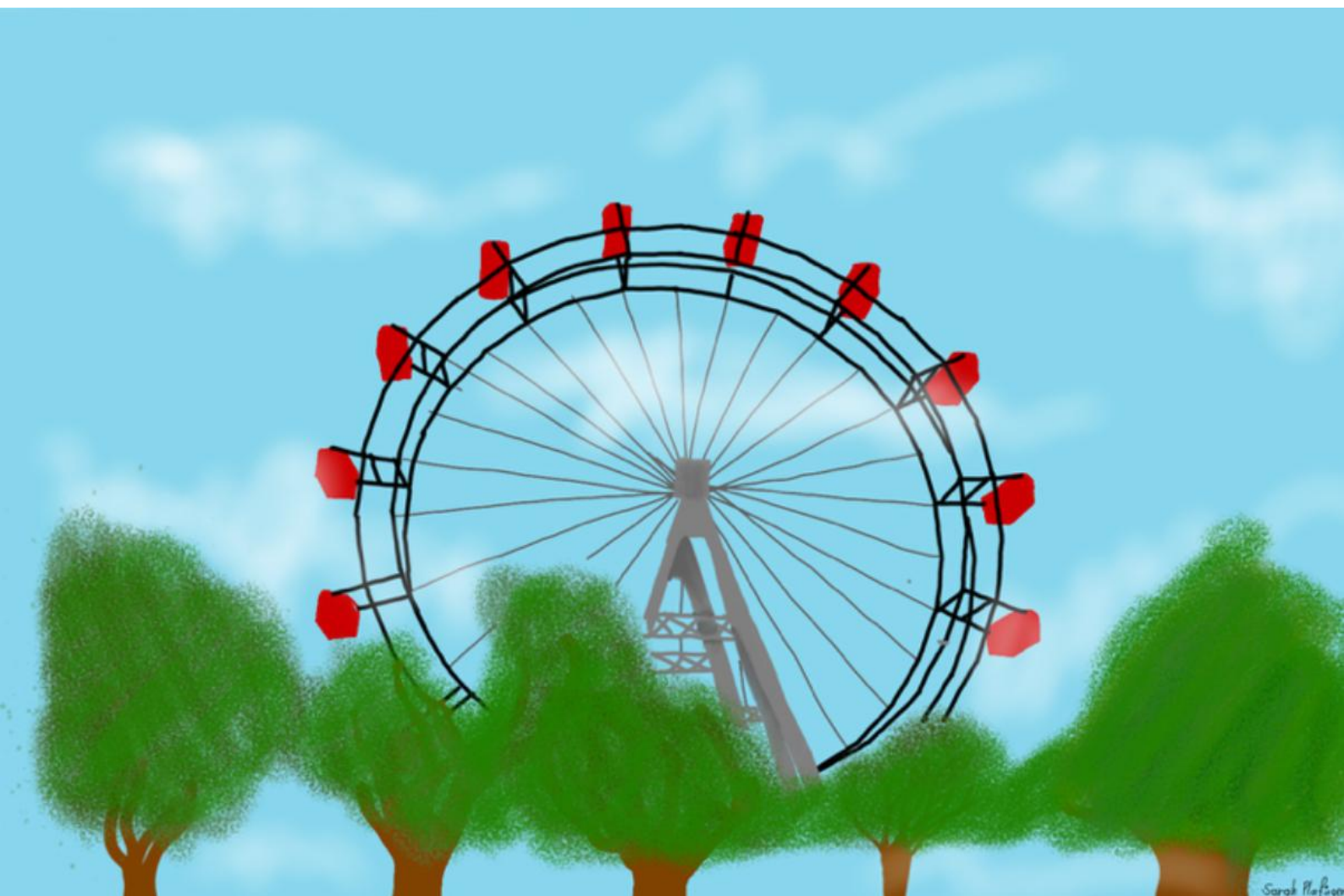
During the week, we got to know each other even

Remembering History

Mauthausen is a small town in Austria that is known worldwide for the Mauthausen concentration camp, one of the largest and most brutal camps established by Nazi Germany during World War II. The Austrian Parliament

The Austrian Parliament is located in Vienna and is one of the most important political centers in Austria. Laws are passed and important decisions for the country are made there. Parliament consists of two chambers: the National Council and the Federal Council.



The National Council Chamber is the largest chamber in Parliament. Here, the 183 members of the National Council meet, discuss political issues, and vote on new laws. The chamber was modernized and equipped with new technology during the Parliament's renovation.

The Federal Council meets in the Federal Council Chamber. Its members represent the interests of Austria's nine federal states. They review laws already passed by the National Council and can comment on them.



A particularly impressive room is the Historical Chamber. It dates back to the time of the monarchy and is now used for ceremonial events and special sessions. The chamber demonstrates the long history of Austrian politics.

The Hall of Columns is the heart of Parliament. It is very large and supported by numerous marble columns. It often hosts events, exhibitions, and press conferences. Many visitors find this area particularly beautiful.



There are also reception rooms. Important guests from Austria and abroad are received in these rooms. They are used for official meetings and special occasions.

A large part of the actual work takes place in the committee rooms. There, bills are discussed and examined in detail before being voted on in the National Council.

Jewish Vienna

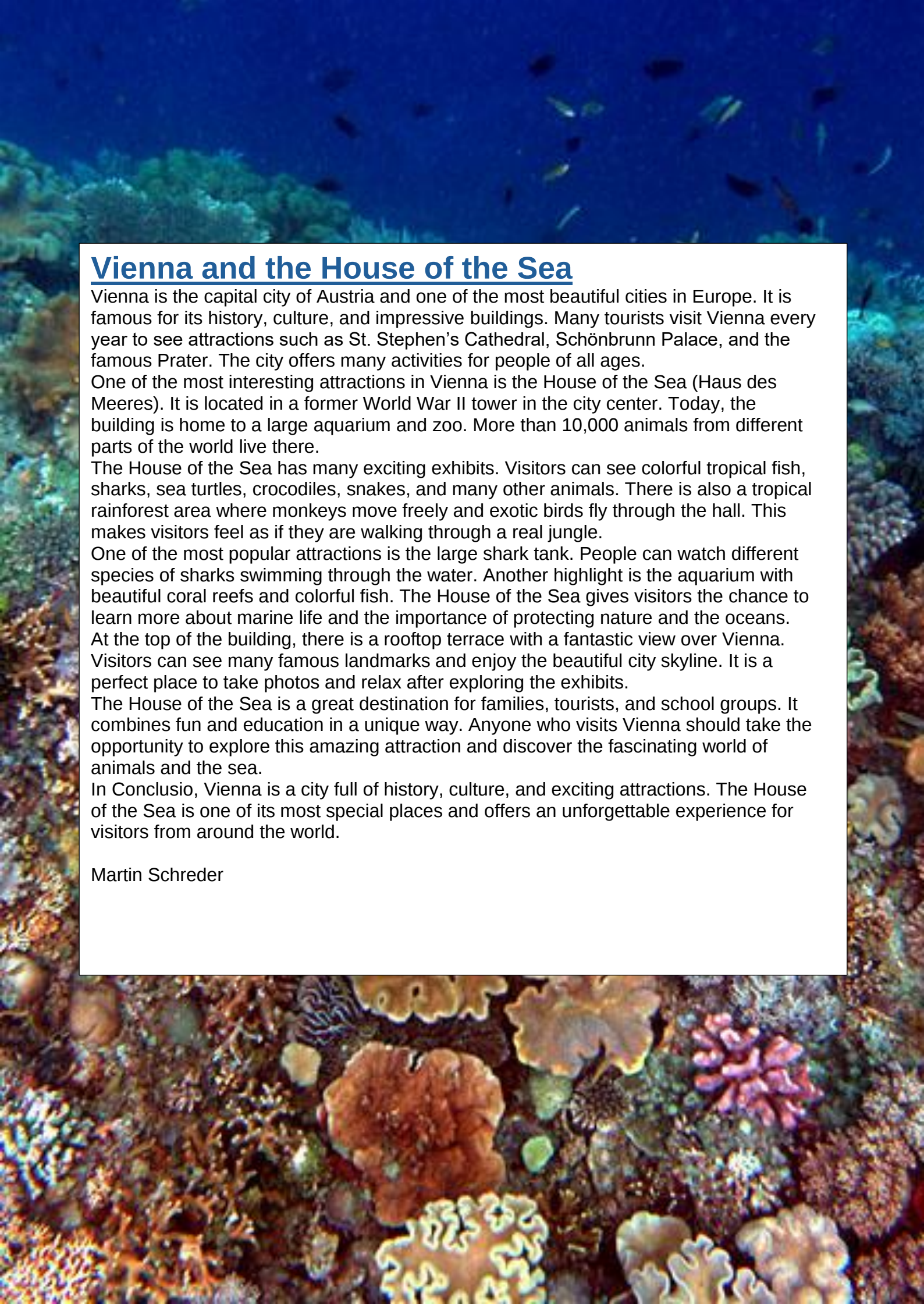
